DONT use blogger unless you are so poor that you can't afford \$10 a month for your own hosting account.

Hostgator (and many other webhosts) allow you to install as many sites as you like on one hosting account, via add-on domains.

If you use Blogger you don't own your sites. Blogger accounts can, and have, been shutdown without notice.

Indexing:

One of the advantages of Wordpress is that when you make a post it automatically pings to alert search engines.

As Carty said, normally your site gets indexed within a week or so.
